**CRIME STATISTICS NOTES**

- The annual reporting period is from January 01 through December 31.
- Campus/Housing in headers refers to on "general campus" and in "student housing areas" (barracks).
- The statistic for the 2007 "Robbery" category was improperly categorized. The 5/11 figure that was reported as "Robberies" was actually the number for "Larcenies" reported on campus which are not reportable crimes for the Jeanne Clery report. The correct number of 2007 "Robberies" should read 0/0.
- The statistic for the 2008 "Burglary" category has been calculated differently from previous years, using data from the original reports, to include some incidents from the "Larceny" and "Lost or Stolen" categories, which are not required in this report, but that more closely fit the "Burglary" category that is required in this report. This has created the illusion that there is a much greater increase in the number of burglaries for the year of 2008 over previous years, which is not the case. The incidents are just being counted and categorized in a different way from previous years.
- The majority of barracks burglary incidents were for minor personal items, e.g.
  - CD's and small amounts of cash left unsecured. These were reported in accordance with NMMI requirements and the Cadet Honor Code, which are more complete than federal reporting requirements. All cadets are provided lockable storage areas in the rooms for their personal items. Our figures are not comparable with other institutions that may not report each incident no matter the dollar value.
- Only arrests for the listed offenses are required to be reported by the Jeanne Clery Disclosure on Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. These statistics also include cases not prosecuted, but referred to the Office of the Commandant of Cadets (Cmdt's Office) for internal discipline. These statistics refer to violations of law, not violations of campus codes or conduct.
- A daily crime log is open to public inspection upon request summarizing crimes reported to the NMMI Police Department except in cases where the disclosure of such information is prohibited by law, disclosure would jeopardize the confidentiality of a victim, or disclosure would jeopardize an ongoing criminal investigation or the safety of an individual, cause a suspect to flee or evade detection, or result in the destruction of evidence.
- There were no instances determined to be hate crimes reported during these periods.

- \*The one report of CSP was investigated by the NM State Police and deemed to be unfounded, prosecution was waived by the District Attorney.

**STATISTICS OF CRIME ON CAMPUS**

In further compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics, included are the number of crimes reported on the NMMI Campus during the last three calendar years.

## AUTO REGISTRATION AND USE

The use of a motor vehicle on campus by those associated with NMMI is a privilege rather than a right; this privilege carries with it the responsibility for the proper registration and safe use of any vehicle on campus. A person's vehicle is their responsibility. This responsibility includes the safe handling of the vehicle, operating and parking it in accordance with regulations, and in such a way as to not constitute a hazard to persons or property. NMMI assumes no responsibility for damage to a motor vehicle or any loss while it is operated or parked on campus. It is the duty of our campus police officers to enforce all applicable State laws, including traffic laws and traffic regulations included in the NMMI Operations and Procedures Manual and the Cadet Blue Book. Staff and faculty are encouraged to become familiar with parking/registration requirements according to New Mexico Military Institute Operations and Procedures Manual.

## NMMI CAMPUS POLICE AUTHORITY

NMMI maintains a campus police department to provide for the safety of cadets, employees, visitors, security of property on campus, and for the smooth operation of campus activities that involve vehicular and/or pedestrian traffic. The department takes an active stance in maintaining a safe and positive learning environment on campus. Campus police officers are present 24 hours per day, patrolling the grounds both in vehicles and on foot. This method of patrol, with its mobility, high visibility, and interactive scope, has resulted in a safe and comfortable environment for those persons working, residing or visiting on campus.

The department is composed of a Chief of Police and four additional officers. It was created under the authority of New Mexico State Statute 29-5-1. All NMMI Police Officers are duly sworn and commissioned by the State of New Mexico and certified by the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy. They have full police authority, just as members of law enforcement agencies in other communities throughout the state, to include the power to arrest. The jurisdictional boundaries of NMMI are the same as the boundaries of any other community, and within the boundaries of campus, the NMMI Police Department is the law enforcement agency of record.

The campus police department has an effective working relationship with other law enforcement agencies in the area. Other agencies may assist in investigations and in situations that extend beyond the boundaries of the campus. NMMI Campus Police Officers also provide assistance when and where requested to other area law enforcement agencies. NMMI Police monitor and record through local and state agencies any criminal activity involving cadets. Limited campus size and the many activities on campus restrict cadets to the NMMI Campus much of the time they are enrolled; however, if a cadet is involved in an off-campus incident, NMMI Campus Police Officers are normally contacted by the law enforcement agency where the incident occurred.

It is a violation of New Mexico State Law to willfully fail or refuse to comply with any lawful order or direction of a campus police officer. Violators can be arrested.

## SUBSTANCE ABUSE POLICIES

NMMI maintains a strict policy regarding the possession, use, or sale of alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs. The campus is designated as a drug-free environment, and cadets may voluntarily participate in the Campus IDFY (Institute Drug Free Youth) Program. The program is proactive. Failure to comply with the alcohol or drug policy, i.e., no alcohol or drugs on campus, will result in severe disciplinary action and may result in suspension or dismissal from NMMI, and/or criminal prosecution. NMMI also maintains a strict policy regarding the possession, use, or sale of tobacco or tobacco products. The campus is also designated as a tobacco-free environment.

## WEAPONS POLICY

Other than weapons issued by the ROTC Departments or used for team purposes, it is a serious violation of the law to possess a deadly weapon on NMMI property. New Mexico State Statute 30-7-2.1 makes it a felony to bring or possess a deadly weapon on the grounds, or within the buildings of NMMI. Such laws are strictly enforced by the NMMI Police Department, and violation will result in severe disciplinary action.

## EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND COUNSELING

NMMI maintains annual educational programs for cadets and employees that promote their awareness of rape, acquaintance rape and other forcible and non-forcible sexual offenses. These procedures outline what people should do if a sexual offense occurs, including who should be contacted, the importance of preserving evidence as may be necessary to the proof of a criminal offense, and to whom the alleged offense should be reported. Participants are informed of their options to notify proper law enforcement authorities, including NMMI and/or local police, and that NMMI personnel will assist them in notifying these authorities, if requested. This includes on and off-campus counseling, mental health or cadet services for victims of a sexual offense. Cadets are notified that NMMI will change the victim's academic and living situations after an alleged sexual offense and the options for these changes, if these are requested by the victim and are reasonably available. Information is made available detailing the procedures for disciplinary action in a case of an alleged sexual offense, including a statement that the accuser and the accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during disciplinary proceedings, and that both the accuser and the accused will be informed of the outcome of any disciplinary proceeding brought alleging a sexual offense. The disciplinary action taken, including sanctions NMMI may impose following a final determination of an institutional disciplinary proceeding, as well as criminal proceedings regarding rape, acquaintance rape, or other forcible or non-forcible sexual offenses is also included.

## REPORTING PROCEDURES MISSING CADET NOTIFICATION

The NMMI Police Department is located south of Saunders Barracks in the basement of the L.J. Marshall Infirmary. Telephone contact with the department can be made by dialing 624-8421.

For emergencies on campus, cadets can call or notify any member of the Commandant's staff. Events or incidents occurring in the barracks should first be reported to a member of the Commandant's staff or the NMMI Police Officer on duty. These individuals are trained to respond to a number of situations and will take actions appropriate to the circumstance. Remember, if you observe a situation or event that should be reported, please act. You should not assume that someone else will report the incident. The individuals responding will immediately contact the outside 911 emergency number, if appropriate. The individuals must be prepared to provide basic data which will allow officials to adequately respond. Identify yourself and clearly describe the nature and location of the event or activity.

Each cadet living in an on-campus cadet housing facility has the option to register a confidential contact person to be notified in the case that the cadet is determined to be missing, and that only authorized campus officials and law enforcement officers in furtherance of a missing person investigation may have access to this information. All cadets, even if they have not registered a contact person, that the local law enforcement will be notified that the cadet is missing. For cadets less than 18 years of age and not emancipated, a parent or guardian will be notified. Official missing cadet reports will be referred immediately to an institutional police or campus security department or local law enforcement agency with jurisdiction in the area.

NMMI maintains strict reporting requirements and operates with a Cadet Honor Code that states, "Cadets Will Not Lie, Cheat, or Steal, or Tolerate Those Among Us That Do." Cadets found in violation of the NMMI Cadet Honor Code are subject to sanctions including suspension and dismissal. Extensive educational efforts are in place each year to ensure a safe, secure environment, and operating with such an Honor Code in place ensures that all cadets report every violation.
