

# Hagerman Barracks

## AGE

- Hagerman Barracks was initially built in 1908; however, additions to Hagerman Barracks were completed in 1924, 1925, 1932, & 1952

## SIZE

- Hagerman Barracks is approximately 102,000 S.F. in size with three primary floors

## PURPOSE

- Hagerman Barracks has 306 rooms and provides housing for approximately 600 cadets. Hagerman also provides offices for Troop Leadership personnel and the Command Post

## HISTORY

- Initial construction of Hagerman Barracks began in 1908. The initial structure was 304 feet long and 40 feet wide and designed to accommodate 120 cadets, two per room. There were also twelve living rooms for officers. This steam heated facility composed the first of what was envisioned as several sections in a quadrangular form.

## NAME

- Hagerman Barracks was named in honor of James John Hagerman, Esq.
- James J. Hagerman, one of the great industrial frontiersmen of the west, has frequently been identified as the primary force behind the economical development of the Pecos Valley. In 1895, he donated 40 acres of land, none of which could be sold in any portion, for the permanent home of NMMI.
