



**GUARANTEED ADMISSION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
AUBURN UNIVERSITY AT MONTGOMERY
AND
NEW MEXICO MILITARY INSTITUTE**





Auburn University at Montgomery (AUM) and New Mexico Military Institute (NMMI) agree to mutual cooperation in the articulation and transfer of courses, and establishment of application and registration processes to facilitate the transfer of NMMI graduates to AUM for the purpose of earning a bachelor's degree. Subject to the terms of this agreement, a student who has earned both an associate's degree and possesses a cumulative GPA of 2.0 from NMMI may be eligible for admission to AUM with up to a maximum of 64 semester hours transferring.

1. Satisfactory completion of the attached program will be required prior to full enrollment at AUM. Students must have earned their associate's degree from NMMI by the time they begin taking classes at AUM.
 - a. If all of the following criteria are met, NMMI students will be guaranteed acceptance into AUM, with up to 64 NMMI awarded credits transferring:
 - i. A minimum grade of C in each core course
 - ii. A cumulative GPA of 2.0
 - iii. Listed as a student in good standing
 - iv. Completion of the AUM application process
 - b. The AUM undergraduate catalog that will be used to determine degree completion will be the catalog in effect the semester the student began studies at NMMI as a full time student, with the following constraints:
 - i. There must be no break in full time status for fall and spring semesters
 - ii. Summer breaks will not count against the student, nor will a student attending classes over the summer at less than a full time status.
 - iii. NMMI students may formally request the application of the catalog in effect the semester they transfer as an exception to this policy
2. Students will complete an application for admittance to AUM prior to the end of their third full semester at NMMI. Summer graduates may apply for the summer or fall semesters at AUM in accordance with AUM's posted application deadlines. Exceptions to this provision will be made on a case-by-case basis and are not guaranteed.
 - a. AUM will waive application fees for NMMI students transferring to AUM.
 - b. NMMI will establish procedures for AUM advisors to facilitate electronic advising and provide the student with a non-binding degree completion program by major.
 - c. This process is to ensure all students in this program (AUM Guarantee) have been advised of all degree requirements remaining, to include any courses that transfer but do not apply toward their desired degree, prior to the beginning of their first semester at AUM. Advisors will ensure NMMI students understand that a maximum of 64 semester hours will be allowed to transfer toward a degree program and/or elective credits.

3. The associate's degree will be awarded by NMMI upon completion of established degree requirements. The establishment of degree requirements and academic advising of the student regarding NMMI degree requirements is the responsibility of NMMI. Upon successful completion of the AUM program of study chosen by the student, a bachelor's degree will be awarded by AUM. Prior to full admission of the student to AUM under this program, AUM must receive a final, official transcript from NMMI showing the associate's degree has been awarded and validating the students GPA.
4. AUM will accept the courses listed in annex A of this agreement provided a grade of C or better has been achieved in the NMMI courses.
5. Each student from NMMI who declares intent to complete the AUM Guarantee Program at AUM shall be co-advised by assigned members of the faculty from NMMI and from AUM during his/her time at NMMI.
6. Any exceptions must have the approval of both institutions.
7. Both institutions hereby agree to notify the other in the event of substantive changes in institutional courses and programs that may have an impact upon this Agreement.
8. NMMI and AUM both agree to freely and widely encourage qualified students to participate in this cooperative undertaking by providing advertisement, information, and other such assistance which eases the transition of students.
9. This Agreement is contingent upon both institutions maintaining regional accreditation.
10. This Agreement shall remain in force from the date on which it is signed until such time as either institution elects to end it. If either institution desires to terminate the Agreement, it will be terminated on the first day of May following written notice of the intention to terminate, provided such notice is given at least 90 days prior to the first day of May.
11. In the event of termination of this Agreement, no new students will be admitted to AUM expecting to benefit from the terms of the Agreement.

New Mexico Military Institute and Auburn University at Montgomery authorize this agreement to become effective on this 23rd day of March, 2011.
