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ACCREDITATION

NMMI is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission for the junior college and Cogna for the high school.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

NMMI is on a 16-18 week semester schedule. In our college program, a semester hour is equivalent to one hour of class time per week. In our high school program, 0.5 credits is equivalent to 50 minutes of class time for five days a week.

JUNIOR COLLEGE

NMMI is a university parallel program which awards an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree.

HIGH SCHOOL

NMMI's high school courses are college preparatory. NMMI offers honor and concurrent enrollment courses. NMMI does *not* rank high school students.

ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

Since our founding in 1891, academic excellence, a distinguished faculty, and a heritage of preparing our cadets to become tomorrow's leaders have been the centerpiece of New Mexico Military Institute. NMMI offers a unique learning experience built upon a curriculum that is mission directed, a comprehensive approach integrating education, training, and experience, and a totally integrated high school and college learning environment.

Academics at NMMI is founded upon teaching the fundamentals in English, Math, Science, language and communication, but enhanced by the knowledge and abilities required of leaders of the millennium generation. Our approach combines a traditional learning focused methodology with the most current state of the art and appropriate educational technologies. The cornerstone of learning at NMMI is a close all-encompassing faculty cadet relationship enabled by morning, afternoon, and evening one on one and group tutoring opportunities.

NMMI is unique because it integrates a four-year college preparatory high school curriculum with that of a two-year university parallel junior college. For this reason we do not think of NMMI as a collated high school and junior college but as a six year seamless learning experience in which cadets progress as fast and as far as their capability, potential, and vision permits.

HIGH SCHOOL CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT & HONOR COURSES

Concurrent enrollment in college courses is available to high school students. College coursework is posted to the high school transcript with an "H" designation after the Course ID (i.e. ENGL 1110 - 3.0 college hours and ENGL 1110H - 0.5 high school credits). Honor courses are designated with an "[H]" after the course name.

TRANSFER CREDIT

College transfer coursework does *not* compute in the grade point average. Grades transfer in as "TR" and compute into total earned hours. High school transfer coursework does compute in the grade point average. High school grades transfer in as "T" and letter grade (i.e. "TA" is equivalent to an "A").

REPEATED COURSES

The notation of "[]" around the letter grade indicates that the course was repeated and the lowest grade has been excluded from the cumulative GPA calculation.

DEVELOPMENTAL COURSES

College developmental courses are used to calculate the grade point average, but do not count towards hours earned.

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Transcript is official when printed with signature of a school official, stamped/raised seal and dated, or electronically with a statement of authenticity.
