Instructions

Using the information provided by you on the 2022-2023 FAFSA, the U.S. Department of Education has compared your records with the Department of Homeland Security and the Social Security Administration. Unfortunately, there was no match between the records. As a result you must confirm your U.S. citizenship or eligible non-citizen status in order to qualify for federal financial aid.

Below is a list of acceptable documents. Check the document that you will submit. Please note that some documents are valid through a certain date. If you submit a document that has expired or will expire while you are enrolled additional documentation will have to be requested in subsequent years. **Submit both front and back copies of all documents.**

If you are a U.S. Citizen you may provide a copy of:

- U.S. Birth Certificate
- U.S. Passport
- Certification of Birth Abroad or Report of Birth Abroad
- Certificate of Citizenship or Naturalization
(Older versions of these documents advise you not to photocopy them. However, the federal government permits photocopying if done for a lawful purpose, such as applying for financial aid.)

If you are a Non-Citizen National you may provide a copy of:

- U.S. Passport stamped “Non-Citizen National”

Eligible Non-Citizen may provide:

- Permanent Resident Card (Form I-551) or Conditional Permanent resident Card (I-551C)
- Arrival/Departure Record (Form I-94) stamped. (Note: The expiration date must not have passed.) The I-94 should show one of the following designations:
 - “Refugee”
 - “Asylum Granted”
 - “Victim of Human Trafficking”
 - “Parolee”
 - “Cuban-Haitian Entrant”
 - T-Visa Holder (T-1, T-2, T-3, etc)
